Many teens have an open invitation to stop by and fish whenever they want, and it is not uncommon to have teens fishing several nights a week. These fishing times often turn into times of discussion about life, future, and struggles.

One such night, a high school senior that I do not know very well stopped by to fish.

While fishing together, a wide array of topics came up from girlfriend to graduation and even working for his grandfather. The time got away as we caught bluegill and bass and talked as the evening became night. This young man does not come from a church background and has had a difficult family at times and he shared all that as we

fished. We talked about how God made the different types of fish, and He created all we know (a foreign concept to him) and that He sent His son to the earth. This ordinary evening of just stopping by to fish turned into a spiritual appointment with future fishing talks to come. This young man is not an isolated case, we have talks around the pond all the time with teens about all kinds if



things. I guess that us why Jesus said... "I will make you fishers of men."
