"Bunny eggs are empty and that has something to do with Easter, right?"

Lately, we have noticed a lack of student leadership at our Thursday night group at our Wadsworth ministry site. For many years, we had students that grew into those roles, but as I've shared before we are VERY young right now. Recently though, we decided that there are

few students who have showed growth and maturity, and I felt it would be a good time to start up our discipleship/leadership group. The goal of this group is to foster spiritual growth and leadership skills in the kids who have shown a desire to grow deeper. When I brought up the idea to Laurie, she had the exact same six kids in mind to invite to the group that I did! Of those six kids invited, four of them have shown to be committed to the group. Over the past few weeks, we've looked at what it means to be a leader in general, and what that could look like for them to put into action at The Garage. We've given them some ownership in having input on structure of club nights. At the last meeting, they said they'd like to have ability to do to in-club things that involve leadership like reading scripture for the lessons. This group also gets opportunities to do some extra fun things as well with plans to do a day trip to Cedar Point this summer. It's been cool to see them step up, and we are even seeing results in the overall group as they have taken some ownership in inviting new kids to The Garage. Recently I gave them "homework" and explained to them the idea and purpose of "life verses," I encouraged them to carefully consider some areas of their life that they would like to research scripture on and see if they could come up with a verse they could daily apply to their lives. This past week, they came prepared, and the two verses above are two of the ones that they chose! One young lady had been already reading through 1 Corinthians and came across that verse. The other found the verse in Ephesians by topically finding verses using some internet sources. I encouraged them to print them off or put them as their phone backgrounds and make them something they see and reflect on daily. I'm really excited about the potential of the kids in this group and what God is doing in their lives! Please pray specifically for them that they may grow in their relationship with God and that He will use them to impact the other students!
